



# **Recipe Corner**

**Goat Cheese Kisses** (Just in time for Valentine's Day!!)

3/4 cup olive oil

1 Tbsp. dried herbs (any kind you like)

1 Clove garlic, crushed

8 Sheets Phyllo dough

6 oz. Chevre



Heat olive oil w/herbs and garlic until warm (don't boil). Remove from heat and let steep 15 minutes. Strain and cool. Stack 4 phyllo sheets, and cut into a 12" square. (Freeze the remainder for another use) Cut square into 9 four inch squares. For each kiss, place one square (one layer) of phyllo on a flat surface. (Cover the rest of the phyllo with a damp cloth as you work). Bruce wil oil, then add three more phyllo layers, brushing each layer with oil. Place about 2 tsp of cheese in the center, and pull all corners together, pinching to enclose cheese. Repeat procedure with remaining 4 sheets of phyllo dough. Bake on an oiled cookie sheet or in oiled mini-muffin pans at 400 degrees for 10-12 minutes. Yield 18 kisses.


