Gift of the Old One

Year End Committee Reports

All American Committee:

The ALBA All American program had 61 entries from 9 exhibitors in 2022. Judges for the program were Emily Thompson, Aaron Carter and Tom Cox. We appreciate the time and effort they all spent in judging our program.

I response to a few comments from both exhibitors and judges, we voted to require both a side and rear photo of all entries in 2023. While it has been a part of the rules, we have accepted entries with only the side photo but going forward if an entry is received with only the side photo it will be disqualified and not presented to the judges.

Fees will remain the same for 2023. In 2020 we had eliminated the required show wins to participate (due to Covid and the effects it had on shows). We have put that requirement back in for all doe entries. All doe entries must have won a 1st or 2nd at an ADGA sanctioned show. Bucks and groups will not require the show win but group photos must have been taken as a group.

I appreciate being allowed to chair this program and look forward to 2023! Deadline for 2023 is December 10. Entries should be submitted through the online entry form found on our club website.





STANDING COMMITTEE and TASK FORCE REPORTS WITH BOARD ACTION

Constition and Bylaws:

Approved establishment of ADGA Governmental Modernization Task Force to include work on conflicts between Constituiona nd Bylaws, District representation, Postal Ballot process, nomination process, minimum criteria/qualifications for serving on Board of Directors.

Approved revision of electronic signature policy.

Director Ethics Task Force:

Approved amended Directors Code of Ethics to be offered to Directors to sign voluntarily.

Finance:

Approved staff salary for 2024 including levels for the senior accountant and marketing/communications manager to be hired. Approved continued suspension of the \$.50 per transfer funding to the ADGA Research Foundation for 2023. If the audited financial statements for 2023 reflect a profit the funding will be restored.

Approved increasing the transfer fee from \$7.00 to \$8.00 for transfers postmarked within 120 days of sale and from \$8.50 to \$9.50 for transfers postmarked over 120 days after sale effective 1/1/24.

Approved adoption of the revised 2023 budget

Approved adoption of the 2024 budget.

Approved adoption of the 2024 capital budget.

Genetic Advancement:

Approved utilization of breed ID testing for NOA and upgrading program as the means by which standard breed animals of unknown/unregistered origin would be able to enter our registry. Based on DNA test characteristics of animals of unknown pedigree could enter the registry as Recorded Grades if they were any % combination of the accepted standard dairy breeds using the breed ID test but could not contain any assigned percentage of meat or miniature genetics. It is the recommendation of the Genetic Advancement committee that details of the implementation of this program be passed to the Registration Committee to determine. Further Board approval would be required through request from Registration Committee.

Approved Nigerian Dwarf goats with unresolvable parentage exclusions that test 15 >.80 Nigerian Dwarf assignment and no other breed identified in the testing could be given a path to upgrade. The determination of this path would be passed onto the Registration Committee. Further Board approval would be required through request from Registration Committee.

Approved the release of archival DNA marker results at the request of the submitter for a fee of \$5.00.Release of markers to nonsubmitters would require the written consent of the original submitter. When contract laboratory renewal negotiations are complete, marker information will be included in reports from all new DNA test submissions.

Information Management:

Approved IT Department budget.

Approved developing a plan to hire an independent contract programmer to develop an in-house alternative to ADGA Genetics. Executive Committee to develop a continuity plan bridging ADGA Genetics cooperative agreement provider with development of in -house alternative program.

Judges:

Issued a strike to a judge as a result of a formal complaint.

Judges Training, Assessment & Licensing:

Approved increasing the stipend clubs pay to host a Special Judges Training conference from \$5,000 to \$6,000 for Training Conferences with 0-25 candidates and from \$7,500 to \$9,000 for Training Conferences with 25 or more candidates.

Approved one year license extensions for five judges.

Linear Appraisal:

Approved a virtual linear appraisal refresher session for 2024.

Approved measurement of animals for height using the 0-50 linear scale to be published in a format visible to members starting with the 2024 LA session.

Membership:

Approved adding all types of memberships offered and the description of each type of membership to the Guidebook.

National Show Long Range:

Approved the Eastern States Exposition Proposal for the 2026 National Show June 28-July 2, 2026 (stated dates include committee set up and move in)

National Sales:

Approved updated G6S policy for Nubians, Experimentals and Recorded Grades for the Spotlight Sale.

Approved updated CAE test policy for consistency between the Spotlight Sale and Colorama Sale.

Approved reimbursement policy for G6S testing for consignors of animals accepted into the Spotlight Sale and Colorama Sale.

Approved inclusion in the Guidebook of the National Sales Committee to include the Colorama Sale and Spotlight Sale. Committee description to be established by the Executive Committee.

Products:

Approved \$9,000 budget for 2024.

Production Testing:

Approved to expand the window for verification tests on Owner Sampler plans to 45-160 days.

Approved clarifying language for verification tests for Owner Sampler herds. Whole herd VT is required when the majority of the herd (>50% of the milking animals in the DHIR herd) can be tested. In order to meet this standard, more than one annual VT can be performed.

Scholarships:

Reinstatement of full scholarship funding was included in the 2024 budget.

Shows:

Accepted committee recommendations, actions and correction on eleven Report of Awards.

Issued Letters of Reprimand to Judge, Show Secretary and Exhibitor for inadequate supervision of report of awards.


1. In medium bowl, mix cheeses and pepper. Using hands, roll mixture into 10-inch log.



ALBA Specialty Rules

1. The AMERICAN LAMANCHA BREEDERS ASSOCIATION authorizes one LaMancha Specialty show per year per ADGA district for a maximum total of 8 shows per year All applications must be electronically received by **December 31** of the current year to be considered. Hosting shows will be notified as soon a possible after 1/1. Shows applying must have a minimum of 3-5 LaMancha breeders that have shown in previous years.

2. The show must be an ADGA Sanctioned show and open to all members.

3. In order to host a specialty show results (3 placings per class as well as champions) and pictures of all first place winners as well as all champions, reserves and best of breeds as well as best udder and outstanding youth winner and showmanship winners must be sent to the Webmaster within 30 days of the show. Photos MUST be sent in ELECTRONIC format only. A flash drive will be provided with show awards and all results (photos and results) must be mailed to the chair on the drive and in the envelope provided.

4. In accordance with our club goals of promoting youth, our club **REQUIRES** that a younger and older outstanding youth. f you do not feel you can fulfill these requirements, please don't apply for a specialty. Only shows that recognize youth participation and have returned their results at previous shows in a timely manner will be considered for a specialty.

5. The ALBA will furnish awards for all GCH and RGCH winners and Best of Breed in does and bucks. We will also furnish a Best Udder medal and an outstanding youth award as well as showmanship awards. Certificates for winners will be furnished if requested on your application.

6. If your show has split dates, (does on one date, bucks at a later time/location) it will be considered 2 separate shows. Please include both a regular fee and a buck show fee (\$125). If applying for a buck show only specialty, the fee is \$50. Fee for a regular show is \$100. (Sr/Jr/Buck) A Sr/Jr show is \$75.

7. Please include the name of your contracted judge prior to submitting your application. We will not award a specialty without that information.

8. Applications are accepted from October 1 to December 31. Please submit your application ONLINE at <u>www.lamanchas.org</u>. There is a link on the home page and submit deposit by using the Paypal link.

9. These rules and application can be changed at any time at the discretion of the ALBA President, Board of Directors and Specialty Chair.

10. Shows that have hosted may not host again for 2 years. Also shows that have not submitted full results in a timely manner, have not chosen both a jr and sr outstanding youth and/or have not returned both the memory key with results and any unused awards will NOT be considered for future shows for a minimum of 3-5 years.

6. All photos become the property of ALBA archives.. Final entries need to be received December 10. Names of judges will be published after completion of competition. Because there is no way to know how many will enter,

rather than deleting a class because of only one entry, we will post the number of entries in each class with the wins. A Reserve will be given in all classes unless there are only two animals and the 2nd place animal is not worthy. At least one judge would have to deem the animal unworthy at the time of judging.

7. Any Winning entry that has been found to be a misrepresentation of the actual animal will be officially removed from the list of winners and a correction will be published in the next issue of the LaMancha Club newsletter.

8. A Supreme Champion will be awarded to top doe and. A GCH entry will be awarded to two youth exhibitors in each youth category. One will be for GCH junior doe and one for GCH senior doe in each age category (total 4 youth recognized). Youth categories are younger youth of 14 and under and older youth 15 through their 21st birthday at time of show.
